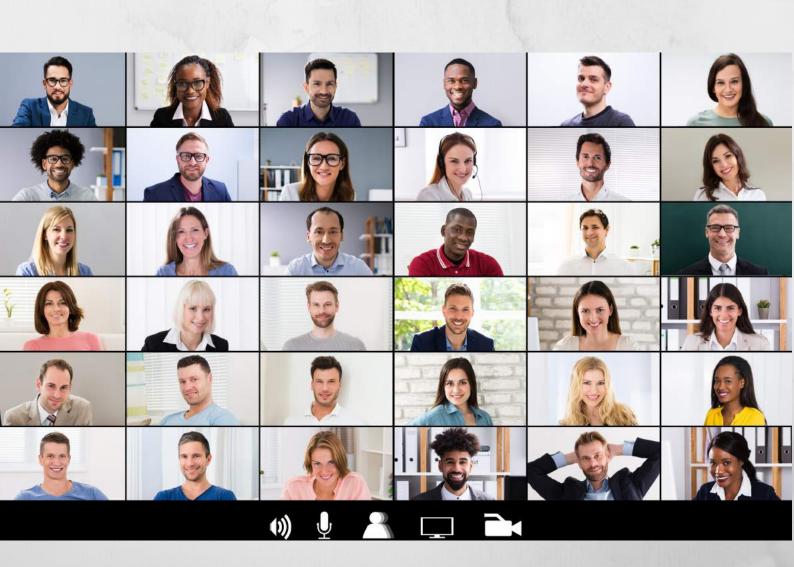


# THE NATIONAL DAY FOR STAFF NETWORKS 2020

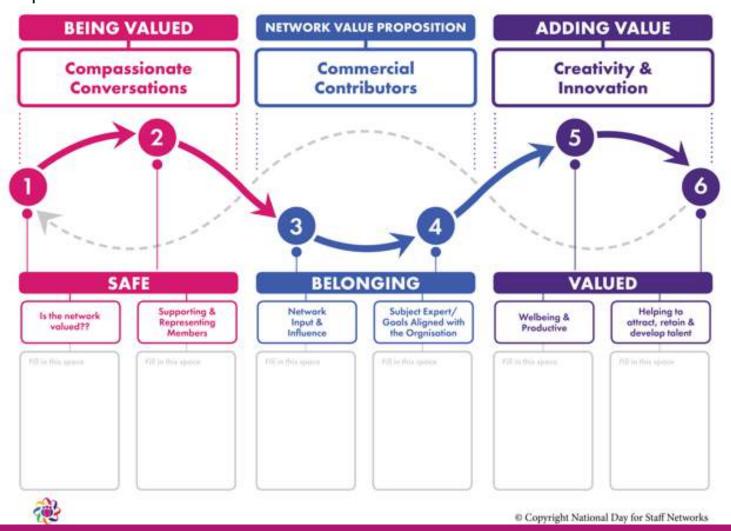

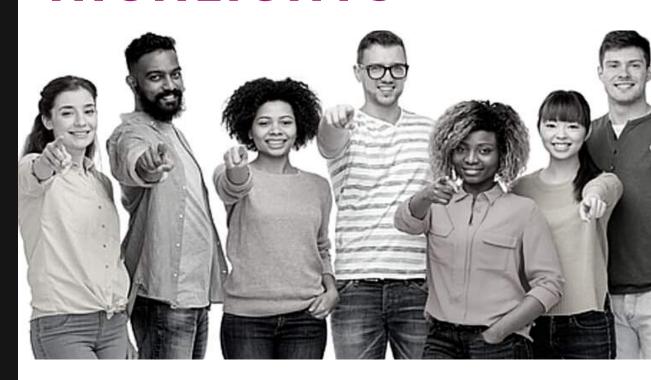

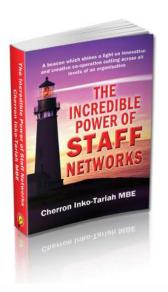
